New "Human Body" Exhibition with world premiere 3D Medical Visualisation For viewing at the Hong Kong Museum of Medical Sciences till Sept 2016

Our bodies are incredibly complex machines which run 24 hours non- stop. Have you ever wondered how our bodies work? Presented by the Hong Kong Museum of Medical Sciences (HKMMS), the new "Human Body" exhibition is organized by the HKMMS curatorial group with medical professionals to unveil the secrets of our amazing human body through interesting exhibits. The exhibition runs from today till September 15 at the HKMMS.

Anatomical dissections of human bodies (大體老師) are used in medical studies and for the first time Hong Kong audience can see 3D medical visualization using real human datasets derived from the most advanced medical imaging technologies such as CT & MRI scanning. Dr K.H. Fung has created unique artistic 3D visualization of these datasets with both still and motion imageries using specially developed 3D computer rendering algorithms. There are various technologies, such as the "Visible Human", 3D printed models of different organs, and 3D-MRI/CT scans of body images made by radiologists. All these technologies enable multiple perspectives to study and view the human body.

One of the highlights of the exhibition is the presentation of state-of-the art stereoscopic 3D technology on 4K ultrahigh definition TV. Through this, we can explore the human body in 3D and be amazed by the detailed structures. The public can view specimens of real human organs generously on loan from the University of Hong Kong Body Donation Programme, and also learn about the brain, muscle movement and vision system through well-illustrated panels, interactive games, and models. 



Through compilation of anatomical data, Visible Human Project can show fine details of human muscles, bones and internal organs.

The Museum building started life as the Bacteriological Institute, Hong Kong's first purpose-built public health and clinical laboratory. Situated in the historic Chinese residential district of Tai Ping Shan, it was built in response to the 1894 Plague outbreak and opened in 1906. In addition to its work in the surveillance and control of Plague and other infectious diseases, it also produced vaccines and provided diagnostic tests.

In 1990, the Government declared the site a Monument, and it became known as the Old Pathological Institute. The Hong Kong College of Pathologists, recognizing the potential of the building, and that it was important for the public to be aware of the history and development in this region, petitioned the Government for its use as a museum. Despite competing claims, the bid was successful. In 1996, the Monument was revitalized as The Hong Kong Museum of Medical Sciences.

In 2004, the Museum was the recipient of the 'Award of Merit in Heritage Preservation and Conservation' presented by Antiquities Advisory Boards.
